Inspiring Governance is the FREE, national online recruitment service that connects schools with skilled volunteers interested in governance roles, including future chair positions. It is backed and funded by the Department for Education. FREE training and support is provided for new appointees through our partnership with the National Governance Association (NGA).

BENEFITS OF VOLUNTEERING AS A SCHOOL GOVERNOR

Volunteering as a school governor is a rewarding role that provides the individual with excellent opportunities for personal and professional development in an exciting and challenging environment. Most importantly they are also contributing to education in their local community.

Inspiring Governance has signed the Armed Forces Covenant to show our support. We feel there are key service personnel and family members, with a wide variety of skills and experience, who could contribute significantly to schools and outcomes for young people, as well as benefitting from the CPD opportunity themselves. Benefits are significant for the entire Armed Forces Community including for:

- those preparing to leave the Armed Forces as they transition to employment in civilian life
- those whose units are not on active duty looking for community involvement opportunities
- partners/spouses looking for an opportunity to develop skills
- those utilising STEM subjects in their role
- members of the civilian workforce looking for career development.



WHO CAN BECOME A SCHOOL GOVERNOR?

There are no particular qualifications required, and anyone over the age of 18 with the willingness to give time to the role and a capacity for working with people can become a governor. The time commitment is usually between 5 and 8 hours a month, depending on the type of school and any additional responsibilities the volunteer wants to take on.

Being a school governor is a great way to develop valuable skills and experience. By volunteering as a school governor people improve their skills in:

- Strategic leadership
- Building effective relationships
- Teamworking
- Budget control
- Communication
- Recruitment

HOW WE SUPPORT PEOPLE ONCE THEY'RE PLACED

We want to make sure any volunteer placed through the service becomes a great governor. That means providing support once they've started. Everyone we place will be able to access a range of support from our partnership with the NGA. This includes:

- a dedicated telephone and email support throughout their first year
- a copy of the essential induction guide for governors or trustees
- access to NGA's online guidance centre containing a wealth of resources
- access to eight in-depth induction e-learning modules via NGA Learning Link
- membership of the Young Governors' Network for volunteers under the age of 40.

Our regionally based Managers can meet with people who are interested in a more strategic approach across the Armed Forces Communities. They offer a bespoke service which includes attending family events, producing materials for your social media/other information networks such as magazines, radio and blogs.
