School governing boards need to include people from diverse backgrounds to fully represent local communities and to better reflect the pupils they serve. They also need people with a good blend of knowledge, skills and experience. So, whatever your age or background and wherever you are in your career, you will have a lot to

WHAT'S THE COMMITMENT?

You will need to attend meetings, typically outside of office hours, and do the necessary preparatory reading. The time commitment is in the region of 5-8 hours a month depending on the school or additional responsibilities you take on.
