Volunteering as a school governor is a rewarding role that provides the individual with excellent opportunities for personal and professional development in an exciting and challenging environment. Most importantly they are also contributing to education in their local community.

Inspiring Governance has signed the Armed Forces Covenant to show our support. We feel there are key service personnel and family members, with a wide variety of skills and experience, who could contribute significantly to schools and outcomes for young people, as well as benefitting from the CPD opportunity themselves. ### WHO CAN BECOME A SCHOOL GOVERNOR?

There are no particular qualifications required, and anyone over the age of 18 with the willingness to give time to the role and a capacity for working with people can become a governor. The time commitment is usually between 5 and 8 hours a month, depending on the type of school and any additional responsibilities the volunteer wants to take on.

### AN OPPORTUNITY FOR PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Being a school governor is a great way to develop valuable skills and experience. By volunteering as a school governor people improve their skills in:

- Strategic leadership
- Teamworking
- Project management
- Building effective relationships
- Budget control
- Communication
- Recruitment
- Influencing and negotiating
